Where is Twig??

Where the heck is Twig, Minnesota? That question has been asked time and again as residents share that their Downtown is Twig. It's also been said that Twig is so small that the "Entering Twig" and "Leaving Twig" signs are on the same post. But, really, where did the name of our "Downtown" originate? Folklore has it that the Postmaster, Sander Peterson, named the post office "Twig" because it was a "branch of Duluth". That sounds plausible but for the fact that the DW&P Railroad had a station near the now Highway 53 bridge over the railroad named "Twig" long before Mr. Peterson was Postmaster. In fact, the Minnesota Secretary of State's records show corporations organized with "Twig" in the corporate name going back to 1926.

The Town Board has fielded inquiries from elementary students who are working on class assignments to find an interesting named town and draft a letter to a Town official requesting information about how the town was named.

So, this begs the question. Where did the name "Twig" originate? We'd like to know if you know. If you have facts (not folklore) that explain how the name originated, we'd like to know. Also, do you have any information about the history of Grand Lake Township that you'd like to share? Would you be interested in serving the Township as Town Historian? Bachelor Road Update

As we shared previously, the railroad crossing at the Bachelor road does not approach the railroad at a right angle. That creates visibility issues for school busses and large vehicles as it is more difficult to view the railroad tracks to the north. The Township has been successful in securing funding to upgrade the crossing and plans were falling in place for the work to be completed on Saturday, October 28. As we all know, an early snow storm occurred on October 26, interrupting the project which will now be scheduled for Spring, 2018. Thank you to Minnesota DOT for the grant, St. Louis County for their help with moving this project forward and to Minnesota Power for an easement to accommodate the changes.

Baseball Field Upgrade

Grand Lake Township has a wonderful baseball field at Twig and the field is about to get better. On October 17, the Town Board approved the purchase of an electronic scoreboard for the baseball field. The Twig scoreboard is one of four the League has received approval for. The Proctor Area Little League worked hard to get the most bang for the buck by enlisting the following donations:

- Local electrical union providing all electrical supplies, labor and project support to install/power all 4 score boards including updating electrical at some of the facilities.
- Local operator union providing all ground work, trenching and efforts to run electrical to scoreboard locations and areas being updated at fields.
- Collective purchase of 4 score boards ultimately saving money by purchasing all in a bulk order.
- Freight provided by Foster trucking picking the score boards up in Kentucky at no cost during a return trip to the Duluth/Superior area.
- Russell Steel providing steel I beams for the score board uprights/framework.

HMI contractors providing the sono-tubes and concrete work for foundation support of the score boards.

Snowplowing Alert & Town Rd Update

We can't ignore the impending seasonal shift- snow! The Township is finalizing contracts for snowplowing and need the cooperation of our residents. If you live on a Township road, we appreciate your help in ensuring that the area around your property is free and clear for snowplowing. When in doubt, move any obstructions away from the road right-of-way. The same early snow storm that interrupted the Bachelor Road project also made a mess of our Town roads. The slushy conditions disrupted the gravel roads, creating some issues that the subsequent freezing conditions locked in. Be assured that, should the weather abate and we have a thaw, the grader will be out to try to remedy any issues caused by the storm and freezing. It has always been the Board's goal to have all roads at optimum condition before the freeze hits and we will do all we can to ensure they are the best they can be for Winter.

Holiday Reservation Lottery Policy

Due to the popularity of the Grand Lake Town Hall/Community Center, reservation requests for Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Eve and Christmas Day, reservations will be granted via a lottery entry form and requests are accepted six (6) months prior to the requested date. Lottery/Reservation forms must be received between the 1st and 15th day of the submittal month. Potential reservations are chosen in a "random lottery drawing" at a regularly scheduled board meeting.

Thanksgiving Day request forms are to be submitted in May. Christmas Eve and Christmas Day request forms are to be submitted in June.

Note: Along with your entry form you must submit a check for \$25 for the entry fee. Should you be picked for the holiday date requested your \$25 will be applied towards your \$100 refundable deposit. All entry forms and fees that aren't picked will be returned. If you are picked for the holiday date you will be contacted to make arrangements for the deposit. Should you cancel prior to the holiday your deposit will not be refunded. All refundable deposits will be returned following the holiday.

This policy will be in effect for the holidays listed above starting in 2018. Note: Residents of Grand Lake Township only are to be considered for these holidays.

Stop Telemarketers from Calling You

The National Do Not Call Registry gives you the choice about whether to receive telemarketing calls at your home or your cell phone. Scammers have been making phone calls claiming to represent the National Do Not Call Registry. They claim to provide an opportunity to sign up for the registry. Do not respond to these calls. The Do Not Call Registry accepts registrations from both cell phones and land lines.

1-888-382-1222. You Must call from the phone number that you want to register. You can register online at donotcall.gov. Telemarketers should not call your number once it's been on the registry for 31 days. If they do call, you can file a complaint at: www.telemarketing.donotcall.gov.

Beware of Scams

Listed below are some common scams reported by the Sheriff that are common in our area.

- Sweepstakes-Lottery: you won big money but need to send money to them first to cover money transfer expenses.
- Overpayment-checks: you are due a rebate for an overpayment but the check was made out for to large an amount. You need to send the difference before they'll release the rebate check.
- Grandparents-emergency: supposed relative in emergency, car broke down, stranded, etc. please send money
- IRS phone calls: the IRS never initially calls you. If you have a problem they'll notify you by mail.
- Computer repair: you get a notice your computer has a virus. They ask for passwords so they can "fix it". They get personal information off the computer. They may set up future breakdowns that you would need to pay again to fix.

Neighborhood Watch

Nationally, many people are concerned about the threat of rising crime in their communities. Fortunately, there are ways to help protect your home and your neighborhood from crime. From simple steps like keeping your doors locked to starting a Neighborhood Watch program, there are plenty of things you can do to prevent crime.

Work with your neighbors to keep your neighborhood clean and orderly. Keep spare keys with a trusted neighbor, not under a doormat or planter, on a ledge, or in the mailbox. Set timers on lights when you're away from home so it appears to be occupied. Illuminate or eliminate places an intruder might hide: the spaces between trees or shrubs, stairwells, alleys, hallways, and entry ways. With many law enforcement agencies cutting costs, it has never been more important for citizens to work together to prevent crime. If something seems suspicious, report it by calling 911. Broadband Update

The Grand Lake Township Broadband Committee has been researching high speed internet services for our area and has asked us to share their findings with our residents. For years, many of us have used DSL connected to a land line to access the net. If service was available, we would often see speeds of 6-8 Mega Bytes down, and .5-.7MB up. This falls well short of the national standard of 25MB down and 3MB up. A newly upgraded option is now available to nearly all addresses on Sunny and Shady Lanes. Savage Communications Inc. (SCI) can now provide us with speeds as high as 200MB. Typically a connection of 30MB down and 3MB up, bundled with digital telephone service will cost the same as, or slightly less than, the current land line and DSL service that we now use. There are no contracts required and no installation costs in most cases. If you are a seasonal resident, disconnect at the end of the season is free. Reconnect next season is available for a very reasonable fee. For more information and current pricing, SCI can be reached at 800-222-9809.

Motor Vehicle Accidents: 1 (Passenger Car, Semi Truck)

In a fire, seconds count. Seconds can mean the difference between residents of our community escaping safely from a fire or having their lives end in tragedy.

That's why this year's Fire Prevention Week theme: "Every Second Counts: Plan 2 Ways Out!" is so important. It reinforces why everyone needs to have an escape plan. Here's this year's key campaign messages:

Draw a map of your home with all members of your household, marking two exits from each room and a path to the outside from each exit.

Practice your home fire drill twice a year. Conduct one at night and one during the day with everyone in your home, and practice using different ways out.

Teach children how to escape on their own in case you can't help them.

Make sure the number of your home is clearly marked and easy for the fire department to find.

Close doors behind you as you leave – this may slow the spread of smoke, heat, and fire.

Once you get outside, stay outside. Never go back inside a burning building.

Replace Smoke Alarms

This year's Fire Prevention Week campaign is "Don't Wait - Check the Date! Replace Smoke Alarms Every 10 Years".

Why focus on smoke alarms? Because the National Fire Protection Association's survey data shows that the public has many misconceptions about smoke alarms, which may put them at increased risk in the event of a home fire. For example, only a small percentage of people know how old their smoke alarms are, or how often they need to be replaced. As a result of those and related findings, the NFPA is addressing smoke alarm replacement this year with a focus on these key messages:

Smoke alarms should be replaced every 10 years. Make sure you know how old all the smoke alarms are in your home.

To find out how old a smoke alarm is, look at the date of manufacture on the back of the alarm; the alarm should be replaced 10 years from that date.

If you cannot find the manufacture date, more than likely it is over 10 years old.
